Mass Guidelines to follow as we open Mass for public

We are open for public Mass, while we recognize that many are eager to return to Mass in our churches, it remains important for those who are elderly and otherwise at risk to refrain from returning to public liturgies until it is safe to do so. All the faithful continue to be dispensed from their Sunday Obligation until further notice. Those who are sick must stay home. Those considered high risk and their caregivers are strongly encouraged to stay home. When coming to Mass it will look differently. We are allowed only 33% of capacity. So, that will be about 45 people to attend Mass at a time. The doors will be opened 30 minutes prior to each Mass time and will be locked when we reach full occupancy or when Mass begins, whichever comes first. The doors will be propped open for ease of entrance. Here are some other changes that you need to know prior to coming to Mass. These are in line with the CDC guidelines and have been approved by the Bishop:

- •Anyone over the age of 2 must wear a mask at all times. If you are not able to wear a mask, please do not plan to come to Mass as you will not be let in without one. If you have a child that can't keep a mask on, they cannot come.
- •We do have sanitizer, but please bring your own if you have it.
- •There cannot be a choir only a cantor to lead the music.
- •There will be ushers directing you where to sit. We will fill in from the front to the back to keep social distance guidelines and you can only sit with people within your household.
- •We will exit from back to front and can't gather in the parking lot. There will be ushers directing you when to leave.
- •The collection basket will be on the table as you enter the church. Please put your envelope or donations in the basket when you arrive or as you leave.
- •During Communion –Fr. Emmanuel will give instructions on how it will go. You cannot receive by mouth at this time and there will be no Cup.
- •The bulletin will be on our website. If you don't have access, call the office and we will see what we can work out. All other resources can be found online as well.
