

Reflection

Following God's Will

Moses reminds the people in the first reading of the commandments of God. He urges them to be unwavering in order to be successful in life. He warns them to observe them carefully and not to add or remove anything from it because their steadfastness to the commandments will be the testimony to the nations of God's love and fidelity for His people.

The best way to be faithful to God's commands is to allow our hearts to be transformed by it. Unfortunately, we sometimes pay too much attention to the externals and forget the internal – the soul. So, rather than pay excessive attention to the letters of the law and physical purity, we must uproot those things within that lead to sin because "from within people, from their hearts come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery,

I pray for the wisdom and strength to do God's will

greed, malice, deceit. Licentiousness, envy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile" (Mark 7:20-23). God's will must move us to forgive others, arouse a spirit of repentance within us and stir us in the path of holiness and love.

Year of St. Joseph

On the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, Pope Francis has released an Apostolic Letter about Saint Joseph and has declared a "Year of St. Joseph" which will be observed from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021. The letter, Patris corde ("a Father's heart") is released on the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as patron of the Universal Church.
