

HIS KINGDOM IS NOT OF THIS WORLD

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe was established by Pope Pius the XI a century ago in 1925. The pontiff had in mind to use "the feast to counter the growing secularism and atheism of the time. He wanted to continually remind Christians that their allegiance should be to their spiritual ruler in heaven, not to earthly supremacy". The feast is also a reminder that Christ's reign is eternal, but the governments of this world come and go.

The First World War had just ended, and the pope saw that everywhere in the world people struggled with faith as they were trying to recover from the devastation caused by the war. He saw human societies abandoning Christian values, attempting to build a world independent from God. A world based solely on human powers and resources. How could this ever be? Well, here's a borrowed story I have redacted that describes the absurdity of a world that fails to recognize the King of the Universe:

Not very long ago, a scientist was in a conversation with God, and he told God, "Look, God, the world does not need you anymore. Nowadays, we can do our own miracles. We can give new life to a dying person by transplanting organs and harvesting embryonic stem cells. We can now cure almost any disease, and we can even clone animals. Before long, we will be able to clone humans, too. I'm sorry, God, but I have to tell you that you have become obsolete."

God listened patiently to the scientist and said, "I understand that. However, I love you, and I don't want you to be miserable. You said you are going to clone humans. Let's make sure you will not make a big irreversible mistake. So, I propose we hold a human-making contest." The scientist replied, "Oh That's a good idea!" God said, "Okay, Let's do it the way I did it when I created Adam and Eve, and I want you to lead". The scientist said, "no problem", and reaches down to scoop up a handful of dust. "Oops! Wait a minute", God said. "You make your own dust. That's the one I made!" At this point, the contest was over even before it started.

This Solemnity is coming right after Thanksgiving, always just before Advent. We have just risen from our gatherings with family and friends where we thanked them for who they are to us. We would never ignore the power of God who brought them into our lives in the first place.

Christ is our king. But his kingdom is not of this world. God is not competing for relevance with science and technology. He is not in a contest with atheism. He is not dragging kingdoms with the rulers of this world. God's kingdom is the reign of peace and love. His wish for us is that the peace and love will begin in our hearts. Blessings.
