

JESUS IS OUR STAR

On Epiphany day, we celebrate Jesus' manifestation of himself to the three wise men from outside the Jewish land, teaching us that he is God both of the Jews and the Gentiles. In Christ, God is reconciling the whole humanity to himself.

The gifts brought by the three wise men to the baby Jesus are very symbolic. Biblical story has it that they gave him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. In ancient time and today alike, gold is an important part of the regalia of kings. The aromatic smell of frankincense makes part of our liturgical worship on special occasions. The oil made from myrrh was one of the ingredients of holy anointing. So, in a flash, the visitors brought together the life, ministry and death of Jesus. Their gifts symbolized his kingship (which, as he would later explain during his passion, is not of this world), his eternal priesthood by which he is the mediator between us and God the Father, and his death to save us.

The bible also points out the importance of the star during the journey of the magi. As the wise men were looking for a way to get to where Jesus was, Herod invited them, and told them, if you find him, let me know so I can go and worship him. Herod was not being sincere. Therefore, the star led them to where Jesus was, and the angel warned them in a dream not to go back to Herod.



The star itself is the light of Christ. One could say that Christ appeared in the form of a star and led the magi to himself. It is that light, Christ himself whom we celebrate always. The light that shines, not only around us, but in us and through us. The call is for us to be the light of Christ to the people around us, leading them to Christ as much as possible.
