JOY IS IN THE AIR!

I have special love for third Sunday of advent for three reasons. First, because we get to wear the rose color, and that happens only twice in a year. Second, because we begin to smell Christmas which is around the corner. Third, because of the message in the readings, the invitation to rejoice. It is called Gaudete Sunday. The Latin word, gaudete with which we describe this Sunday means rejoice.

So, today we light the third candle on the Advent wreath. It is called the Joy Candle or the Shepherd Candle. The rose color reminds us that the joyous feast of Christmas is near. The prophet Isaiah, in the first reading exhorts us to shout for joy and sing joyfully. In the second reading, St Paul repeats himself, as if he wasn't sure whether we heard him the first time "Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice!"

I think that the Church is doing two things on this day. One, we are kind of taking a break from the penitential character of advent as was symbolized with violet last week and the week before. Two, the Church is letting us have a little bit of the feeling of joy brought by Christmas. It's like saying that "since Advent is a penitential season, akin to a 'mini' Lent, the Church celebrates a day of joy ... as we draw closer to the end of Advent and (look forward to) the arrival of Christmas, the Nativity of Our Lord"

Joy is one virtue we would never get enough of. There is always room for more. Note, however that we should not be selfish in seeking and celebrating our joyous moments. Otherwise, joy would not spread. Our joy is complete when it is shared with others. As Christians we have been sent to bring glad tidings to the poor; to join in healing the broken hearted; to proclaim liberty to captives: to share the gospel of Jesus Christ. Just to spread joy. Think about the feeling in you when someone writes back to you and says "thank you, I can't express in words how much your card meant to me". Now, that's only a card, yet it brought them so much joy. We could do more, and the joy continues to spread. Joy is in the air. Blessings.
