THE WEDDING AT CANA

The account for the Wedding of Cana is only recorded in the Gospel of John. It is a few days after his baptism that he is attending a wedding feast with his new disciples. When the wedding party runs out of wine (this would have been an embarrassing situation for the host), Jesus' mother asks him to help. Jesus' response is by turning the water into wine.



The Gospel of John tells us that “Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs in Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him” (2:11).

John's Gospel only contains Seven Miracles. Each of these is a sign that reveals Jesus as the Son of God. This first sign shows his power over creation. His mother proves her belief in him, by simple asking him to do something deemed impossible or miraculous. But now his disciples begin to believe as well.
