

THE GIFTS AND THEIR FRUITS (2)

One month ago, the bishop was at Rosary Chapel to confirm one of our young parishioners. My guess was right that he would begin his homily on that occasion in his usual style at such ceremonies by asking the people, "Do you think Miss ... is ready for the sacrament of confirmation? And do you think she is worthy to receive the sacrament?" Expectedly, the people answered yes to the two questions, but the bishop immediately pointed out that she might be ready for the sacrament, but not worthy because we are never worthy to receive the gifts of God.

The bible talks about two important things in relation to the Holy Spirit – the gifts of the Spirit, and the fruits of the Spirit. At confirmation we all receive the free gifts of the Holy Spirit. We receive wisdom, understanding, counsel, knowledge, fortitude, piety, fear of the Lord. These come to us free, through the valid actions of the minister in communion with the Church cooperating with the readiness of the recipient. We are never worthy of these, but God gives them to us anyway.

The expectation is that the gifts we receive will be developed into fruits. It is then that the Holy Spirit would be said to have become fully active in us. So, the fruits of the Holy Spirit are how we respond to those gifts through the good deeds we perform in our daily lives. Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, generosity, faithfulness, self-control are among the fruits we bear. We can't see the Spirit, but we can feel the working of the Spirit through these fruits.

Let's take peace and joy for example. This is the connection of the very depth of our souls to the spirit of God, which gives us a harmony and serenity which can endure any of the changes in life. If these fruits are in us, whether things go well or not, whether we are healthy or sick, successful or not, we maintain a level of calmness that carries us through. Come, Holy Spirit, we need you! Blessings.

VHAT IS PENTECOST?

Pentecost (from the Greek word "Pentecoste" meaning "50th day") is the one of the most prominent feast days in the Christian calendar. It is often referred to as the "birthday of the Church."

It marks the day, nearly 2,000 years ago, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, who had been living in fear for fifty days following the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday.

Emboldened by the Holy Spirit, the apostles set forth to tell all people in Jerusalem of the Resurrection. As they spoke in tounges given to them by the Holy Spirit, all nationalities present could understand them in their own mother tongue.
